UNITE AND ESCALATE

Inflation is higher than for the last 40 years. Since 2008, wages had already fallen in real terms even before the latest price rises. Almost all of us see our quality of life declining. More people are driven into poverty, with serious impacts on physical and mental health.

We are told we have to accept higher energy costs because of Russia's indefensible invasion of Ukraine, while energy companies report record profits. Inflation pre-dates the invasion, although both the war and Western sanctions (which enrich bosses and drive up prices more than they help Ukraine) made it worse.

Truss doesn't even have answers for British capitalism, never mind us. Rising interest rates won't stop firms putting up prices, but are tipping the economy towards recession. Capitalists need healthy, educated workers who can get to work reliably. Instead we are suffering with a crumbling NHS, Long Covid, inadequate housing, and not enough money to stay warm and well fed. While failing to protect working-class people, the Tories appease the profiteers - from the oil companies to the city to landlords. The limited 'help' they offer is paired with increasing repression - new laws to make it harder to protest or strike.

The Tories resist mass insulation of homes which could keep us warm, lower energy bills and help address climate breakdown. They won't invest in renewable energy or expanded, high quality, affordable public transport. They approve more fossil fuel extraction despite record-breaking temperatures and fires in Britain and horrific floods in Pakistan. They won't tackle rents, landlords or the housing shortage. They hope to distract and divide us with racism and 'culture war' attacks on some of the worst off.

The good news is that more and more working-class people are resisting. Millions can see that there's no point pinning hopes on Starmer's Labour Party. The strikes have been inspirational. Most win at least something and quite a few are managing to stay ahead of soaring prices. The only realistic way to prevent rapid erosion of our pay is to unionise and strike.



We've even seen wildcat strikes by workers at Amazon and Cranswick Foods who weren't yet in unions. The Tories want us to believe that pay rises will cause a 'wage-price spiral', pushing prices up even further, but rising real wages were not the cause of inflation, and lowering them won't end it.

Even though many of the strikes are in the private sector, the government often stands behind the employers and obstructs a settlement, as with the rail industry. The Tories are afraid of workers scoring a big, visible win that lifts all our hopes, so we need to expect some hard fights. Once you are in a fight, it's dangerous to be half-hearted about it. We can bet the Tories won't be. So workers need to demand pay rises that at least match inflation, push our union leaders to escalate the action, and coordinate it across unions and industries to maximise solidarity and pressure on the government.

But it's not just about wages. There's little point winning better pay only to hand it over to the landlord, the bank, the energy company or the supermarket. Those too young, old, sick, unlucky, or busy with unpaid caring to be in paid work are also being hit by soaring prices. We need to defend our public services. So we also need to organise in workingclass communities. It's great to see campaigns like Don't Pay and Enough Is Enough involving hundreds of thousands of people. There are many ways to resist (see over) - socialist organisation helps each of us work out how to do so effectively wherever we are.


